### ***Don Quixote* by Miguel de Cervantes**

### ***The Intuitionist* by Colson Whitehead**

In a parallel world, an elevator inspector of the Intuitionist school turns sleuth to uncover the cause of a catastrophic mechanical failure and defend her methods from Empiricist critics.

### ***Extremely Loud & Incredibly Close* by Jonathan Safran Foer**

Nine-year-old Oskar embarks on a journey into his father's hidden past after losing him in the 9-11 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center.




### ***The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy* by Douglas Adams**
