Explore the untold stories of a unique, historic Nashville community.

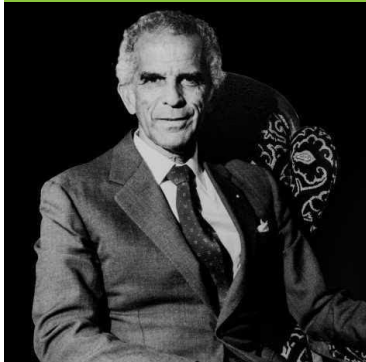
